

### About the Study

#### **Background & Objectives:**

James Cook University Singapore (JCUS)
commissioned Blackbox Research to conduct the
Graduate Employment Survey for 2023 with recent
cohorts of JCU Singapore graduates.

The aim of this survey was to understand JCU Singapore graduates' employment activities post-graduation and evaluate the skills and experiences they have gained during their time at JCU Singapore so that JCU Singapore can develop and deliver industry relevant activities and engagement for their current and future students.




### **Key Outcomes**



84.9% of JCU Singapore graduates from Bachelor courses are employed in Singapore, with two-thirds in full-time roles earning a median salary of SGD 3,500, surpassing the SSG benchmarks.


#### **Key Outcomes: Overall Employment**






### JCU Singapore has demonstrated consistent year-on-year growth across employment rate, full-time employment, and gross median salary.


### Graduates' Employment Journey

#### **Employment Status**


Among Graduates (Employed / Unemployed) excluding currently pursuing further studies or not looking for work





### Close to a third have searched for jobs for 1-3 months after final exams. 1 in 10 found employment before final examinations.

Half of those in Science and technology have found a job 1-3 months after final exams. Higher proportions of those in the Social health and sciences have continued with the employment they had before joining JCU Singapore.

# Graduates' Nature of Work and Income Prospects



Graduates have been working in varied types of organisations. Large corporations, small and micro enterprises and government affiliated organisations are the top organisations students have been working for after 6 months of exams.


