James Cook University is EduTrust Certified. The EduTrust certified on Scheme is administered by the Committee for Private Education (CPE), a part of SkillsFuture Singapore (SSG). EduTrust requires all students to be covered under a Fee Protection Scheme. In James Cook University, this is provided through Fee Protection Scheme Group Insurance. Diploma of Higher Education (Majoring in Psychological Science)

Students with Year 12, GCE 'A' Level or its equivalent but do not meet direct entry to a degree program are eligible to pursue this qualification.

Students in this course will be given a tailored program within the allocated study period to acquire the necessary skills needed to progress to an undergraduate degree program or for applicants who wish to trial the Psychology undergraduate curriculum before committing to the Bachelor course.

Students enrolled in this major will complete two core subjects of the Diploma of Higher Education, along with six subjects contributing to the first year of the James Cook University and the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) accredited Bachelor of Psychological Science.

The Diploma of Higher Education (Majoring in Psychological Science) will also provide an exit point for early graduates who wish to undertake advanced skills or paraprofessional work in the industry.

Upon completion, students may be given advanced standing/exemptions of 8 subjects into the Bachelor of Psychological Science program.

Bachelor of Arts (Majoring in Psychology Studies)

Bachelor of Psychological Science

Psychologists use scientific methods to study the human mind and assess, diagnose, prevent and treat problems. Psychologists are interested in how people think, feel and behave. They study individuals, groups, organisations and communities and apply this knowledge accordingly.

Studying Psychology will give you a unique set of skills to analyse and understand human behaviour, relationships and mental health.

You will study a core program in Psychology and choose additional psychology electives according to your interests and requirements. You will also study electives from non-psychology subjects.

This program is accredited by the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC).

Career Opportunities for Psychology Graduates

Demand for registered psychologists continues to grow in schools, public and private hospitals, academic and applied research settings, law courts, prisons, police forces, defence forces, private practice, consulting firms – the list goes on.

Psychology provides excellent training in analytic thinking and scientific research methods that are relevant to a broad range of careers. These include but are not limited to employment in fields such as community services and counselling, business and market research, education, administration, and management. An increasing number of Psychology graduates work as researchers in industry and government agencies.

Graduates of this course who wish to become fully registered as a psychologist must complete an APAC accredited, Level 2, fourth-year course (e.g., Bachelor of Psychological Science (Honours) or Graduate Diploma of Psychology), followed by the completion of an accredited Masters degree (e.g., Master of Professional Psychology, with one further year of supervised practice or a Master of Psychology [Clinical]). 

Graduate Certificate of Psychological Science



Master of Psychological Science (Majoring in Business Psychology)

James Cook University's Master of Psychological Science (Majoring in Business Psychology) equips learners to understand the human dimension of the challenges they will face as current or future leaders.

The programme core has a strong focus on application of psychological principles to solving problems and achieving desired outcomes across a variety of organisational and professional settings, while the business psychology major applies psychological theory and research practice to core business activities such as management, human capital, and marketing.

Graduates will be equipped with the knowledge and skills to perform effectively across a range of business functions, particularly as leaders and managers.

The Master of Psychological Science (majoring in Business Psychology) program at Singapore Campus of James Cook University is accredited by ABP (Association of Business Psychology), UK. This accreditation affirms the university's commitment to delivering exceptional education and alignment with international standards and best practices in the field of Business Psychology.

The professional program encompasses three main components:

Academic Coursework

The coursework modules are usually delivered in an 8-10 full day workshop format. Students are actively engaged in presentations, role-plays and group discussions.

Supervised Practicum

There is a total of 1,000 practica hours for the Masters program, which are conducted in our on-campus Psychology Clinic and in external clinical settings.

The Research Thesis

The master's research thesis involves conducting a project focusing on an area of clinical psychology and writing it up as a conventional research dissertation or combination of a literature review and journal article.

Master of Psychology (Clinical)

Entry Requirements

- Completion of an AQF level 8 bachelor honours degree with Class 1 or 2A honours from a course accredited by the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council or equivalent qualification from an overseas institution; or
- Other qualifications or practical experience recognised by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor of the Academy as equivalent to the above.
- Applicants who are short-listed for interview must demonstrate their interpersonal skills and personal suitability during the interview

Application forms must be submitted together with certified true copies of academic transcripts, two referees' reports (at least one must be an academic reference), résumé, and a personal statement outlining your motivation to study at Master of Psychology (Clinical).

English Requirements:

 Academic IELTS - Overall score of 7.0 with a minimum of 7.0 in each component; or TOEFL Internet-based score of 94 with a minimum score of 27 in writing, 23 in speaking, 24 in listening and reading; or Pearson (PTE Academic) - score of 65 with a minimum of 65 in each component. (English test results must be less than 2 years old to start date of course).
